

Screening criteria: for visitors

INFORMATION FOR VISITORS

All visitors to correctional centres must undergo COVID-19 screening.

Correctional facilities are vulnerable environments, and we need your help to keep everyone safe.

An Officer will ask you a series of questions before you enter the Correctional Centre. Have the following information ready when you arrive for your visit:

- ✓ Your Visitor Identification Number (VIN)
- ✓ Your contact phone number (so NSW Health can contact you in case of a positive case)
- ✓ The purpose of visit (social, professional, legal)

Screening questions

You will be asked:

- If you are experiencing any COVID symptoms including: a fever, any respiratory symptoms, sore throat, cough, shortness of breath, and/or loss of smell and/or loss of taste.
- If you are waiting for a COVID-19 test result

RAS testing and masks

Visitors five (5) years and above must:

- RAS test onsite prior to entry into the correctional centres and

- wear a CSNSW supplied mask for the duration of the visit. The mask must completely cover the nose and mouth.

Age	Condition of visit
0-4	No RAS or mask
5-11	RAS (accompanying adult to supervise) and mask
12+	RAS (self-administered) and mask

Recent COVID-19 infections

Visitors may provide a medical certificate or Service NSW notice confirming the date of person's clearance from COVID-19 infection and exemption from RAS testing for four (4) weeks, as per the relevant Public Health Order.

General information

All visitors are encouraged to maintain a 1.5m distancing from other visiting groups.

Visit information and screening criteria may change at any time if an increased risk of COVID-19 is identified.
