# 20.11 CSNSW staff at coronial inquests

## **Policy summary**

Corrective Services NSW (CSNSW) officers may be required to attend the Coroner's Court to give evidence at a coronial inquiry.

In such circumstances a CSNSW employee may be personally served with a subpoena or the Coroner may issue a witness list.

Governors of correctional centres will need to make the necessary rostering arrangements when CSNSW officers are required to attend the Coroner's Court.

## 1 CSNSW staff at a coronial inquests

### 1.1 Policy

A CSNSW officer who is required to attend the Coroner's Court to give evidence at a coronial inquest may be personally served with a subpoena requiring their attendance.

The Coroner may also issue a witness list to Department of Communities & Justice Legal (DCJ Legal) with a request to facilitate the attendance of CSNSW officers. Either is sufficient authority for the Governor of a correctional centre to make necessary rostering arrangements.

If an officer is no longer employed by CSNSW, or an officer is on leave and cannot be contacted, the above-mentioned witness list is sufficient authority for the Governor to provide either the last known address of the ex-employee or the address of the current officer (if on leave), so that a subpoena can be served on that person.
